YES Prep has extended its closure of schools and offices through Friday, April 10 to help mitigate the spread of Covid-19 in the community.

This decision is based on the latest guidance from federal, state, and local officials, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and in consensus with the school districts in our greater Houston- Harris County area. We want to reiterate, that we continue to make decisions only after thoughtful consideration and deep discussions with many who are invested in both the education and well-being of our children.

Continuing Student Learning

Please know, learning will continue while campuses are closed after Spring Break. All students have an online learning account through Microsoft, where students can access learning resources from a computer or smart phone. Students are expected to check their email every day for updates once we return from Spring Break. We will share more details and guidance regarding student online/distance learning in the next few days.

STAAR Test

Governor Abbott has waived the STAAR testing requirements for the 2019-2020 school year. We will continue to keep you informed regarding TEA updates as we receive them during this period.
